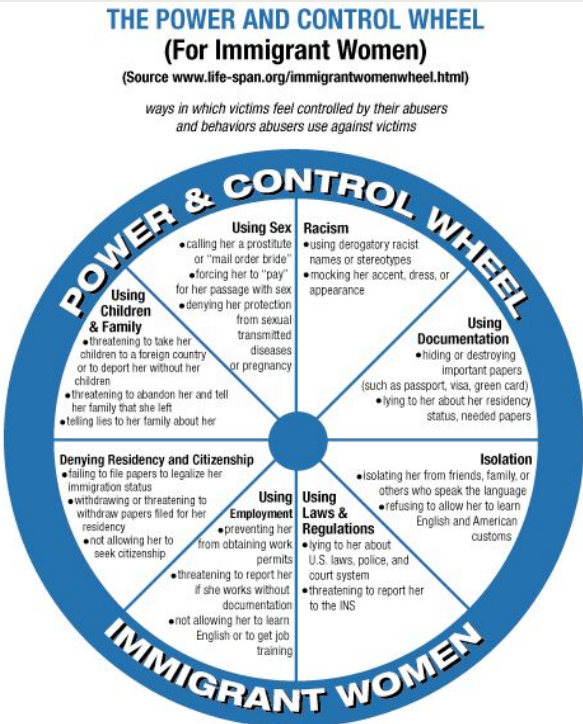

Immigration Status VS. Power and Control

Why Immigrants are more Vulnerable to Domestic Violence?



- Unfamiliarity with legal system
- Lack of Awareness of resources
- Fears of immigration ramifications (e.g., threats of deportation)
- Cultural Values regarding Saving Face in Society
- Afraid of Losing Children
- Language barrier
- Isolation in a foreign land
- Lack of trust in law enforcement
- uncertainty over future
- Economic concerns
- Religious values

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE & SEXUAL ASSAULT IN THE LATIN@ COMMUNITY

1 in 2 More than half of Latin@s (56%) in the U.S. know a victim of domestic violence.

1 in 4 More than 1 in 4 Latin@s (28%) know a victim of sexual assault.

nearly 2 IN 3 Nearly two-thirds of Latin@s who knew a victim of domestic violence (61%) and sexual assault (60%) say that they intervened and did something for the victim.

PREPARING THE NEXT GENERATION

Nearly two-thirds of Latin@s (60%) are willing to get involved in efforts to address domestic violence and sexual assault.

More than 4 in 5 Latin@s (83%) are willing to talk to their children and the children in their lives about healthy relationships.
