What does it take to create a community that does not tolerate domestic or sexual violence?

It starts with trauma-informed, individualized support for survivors, offered 7/24 without fees or judgment. It requires a compassionate and selfless staff dedicated to providing emotional, legal, medical and community resources. It requires a campus intentionally designed with dignity for those experiencing violence so that they may have a safe place to heal and start anew.

It includes consistent and effective education of our young adults, ensuring that they recognize the elements of healthy relationships and the importance of consent. It includes engaged, educated community advocates who understand and intervene in dynamics of power and control.

And it takes generosity.

Since 2021, the number of clients that CSN supports annually has increased by 44%. Our annual budget has increased by 51% over the same time period.

I'm honored to be serving our community alongside the amazing CSN staff, board members, volunteers, community advocates and donors that step so fearlessly into the impactful work of supporting survivors.

“Here at Community Safety Network, how we work with clients is as important as the support and programs that we offer. Creating lasting change in the lives of people affected by domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking starts with engaging each client with deep respect for their individual agency and their ability to make decisions for themselves. As clients explore their choices, we offer compassionate, non-judgmental support.”

Our Impact

From 2021 – 2023, the Community Safety Network

Supported **459 clients**, 90 % of whom were women and 38 % of whom were Latine.

Provided **11,955 bed nights** to individuals and families in the Newton House of Hope, our short-term emergency housing and in Cameron Cottages, our long-term transitional apartments.

Answered **323 helpline calls**.

Provided **3,344 individual services** to clients including: personal advocacy, emotional support, mental health referrals, access to community resources, interpretation, as well as support with medical situations, protection orders, and the criminal justice system.

Ale's Story

“

When I came to Community Safety Network, I felt like I was in so many little pieces. Immediately, CSN felt like a secure place. I knew my kids and I would be safe in shelter. While living there I started to feel like I had a family at CSN – a family that would help me put together a plan but also make time to listen to me when I needed to share what I was thinking or how I was feeling.

With their support I started to put those little pieces back together. It didn't happen overnight, and it is hard to feel like things are really changing when it happens over time. I always had someone to remind me of the steps I had already taken and the things I had already accomplished. It felt like a ball that kept rolling and getting bigger – pushing me along toward my goals like getting a better job.

It felt safe to ask for help. At first I didn't know what I needed, or how to figure out what I needed. And it is so hard to ask for help and not feel judged. I was never judged. CSN offers information in the best way – as choices you get to consider – and you can make a choice or not without feeling like it is right or wrong.

Sometimes I wished that someone would just tell me what to do. In my life before coming to CSN that happened a lot. It was nerve-racking at first to only have options and information. I felt lost. But with practice I realized that I could make decisions for myself that weren't influenced by other people. I made decisions about my kids and their continued relationship with their father that felt right to me, and CSN provided tools and knowledge to help me make those decisions.

After two years in the transitional housing program I am about to become a homeowner. I can't believe I am saying those words! I feel independent. My kids are safe and thriving. I have a great job. I can walk into any space with confidence. I know that my confidence is in me and not dependent on anyone else thanks to the kindness and support I experienced at CSN.”



Our Service Model Pillars

1 | Trauma-Informed

Our approach to client engagement and our range of services is informed by our expertise on the impact of trauma and prioritizes safety, confidentiality, choice, trust, collaboration, and cultural humility.

2 | Client-Centered

We recognize each client within their family, social and cultural contexts and life experiences.

3 | Voluntary

We provide support, encouragement and the resources needed for individuals to engage in a self-determined path of safety, healing and personal growth.

4 | Individualized

We recognize and value that each person is the expert on their own needs, therefore safety plans are tailored to meet the individual concerns of each client.

Do you remember where you learned “how” to date? Most of us didn’t grow up with conversations about consent. The opportunity to engage local students in conversations about healthy relationships is critical to creating a world free from violence. Luckily, in our community, those conversations start in middle school as kids are exploring romantic relationships with their peers. In partnership with school leadership, CSN creates safe, relevant spaces for students to ask provocative questions and consider relationships through a lens of mutual respect.”

647 students directly engaged in healthy relationship education in 2022.

That’s 43% of all local middle school and high school students.

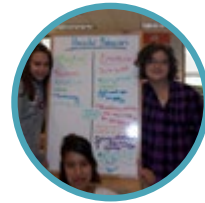

Education Program Spotlight

Safe Bars

In May of 2023, CSN partnered with Safe Bars, a nationally-recognized best-practice violence prevention organization, to train local restaurant and bar staff in skills and practices that create safe, welcoming and respectful environments for patrons and employees. Participating local businesses included Jackson Hole Mountain Resort, the Silver Dollar Bar and Grill, the Million Dollar Cowboy Bar, the Fine Dining Restaurant Group, Teton Tiger Restaurant and Cocktail Bar, Local Restaurant and Bar, Trio, The Center for the Arts, and Snake River Brewing Co. Additional training has been offered to the Stagecoach Bar and Teton Pines. This train-the-trainer seminar ensures that our community has a deep bench of experts on de-escalation and bystander intervention practices.

Education Program Spotlight

New in 2022

Latina Empowerment Circle

In November 2021, the Jackson Hole Behavioral Health Needs Assessment results indicated that Latina women experience higher rates of intimate partner violence than their white peers.

In January 2023, Community Safety Network, in partnership with Voices JH, Teton Behavioral Health and Teton County Public Health, responded to this need with a new pilot program: Latina Empowerment Circle. This pilot utilized the Sí, Yo Puedo Curriculum and Program by Catherine Fuchsel (2018), an 11-week program promoting education on domestic violence, consent, self-esteem, parenting, and healthy

relationships using a culturally relevant, strengths-based framework.

The response to the pilot was profound, with a waiting list for the first cohort. Participants reported an increased awareness of the dynamics of domestic violence and community resources. They experienced personal growth, established support networks, and praised the accessibility, clarity, and cultural relevance of the program. This program will be expanded in 2024 to include a second session for the pilot cohort and provide the current curriculum to a new cohort.

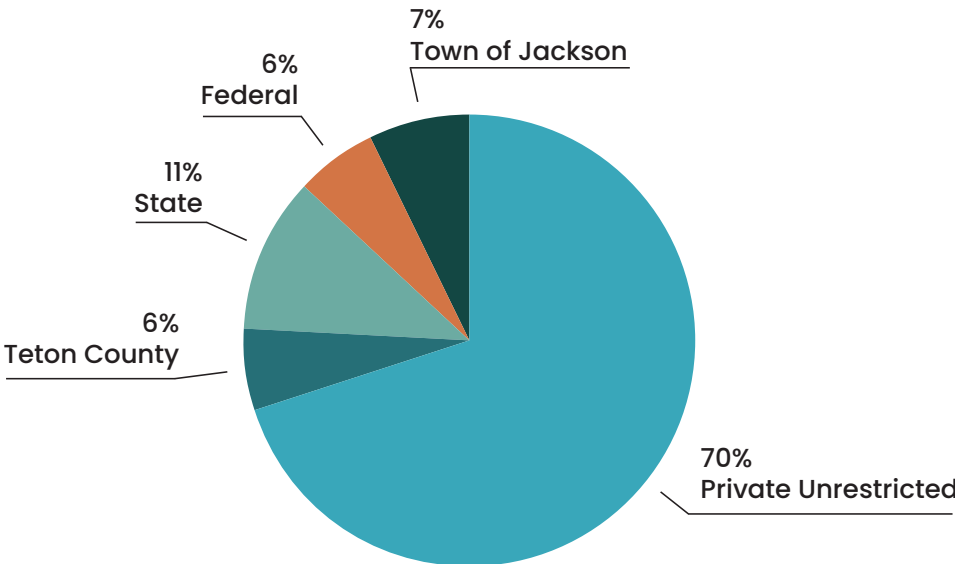

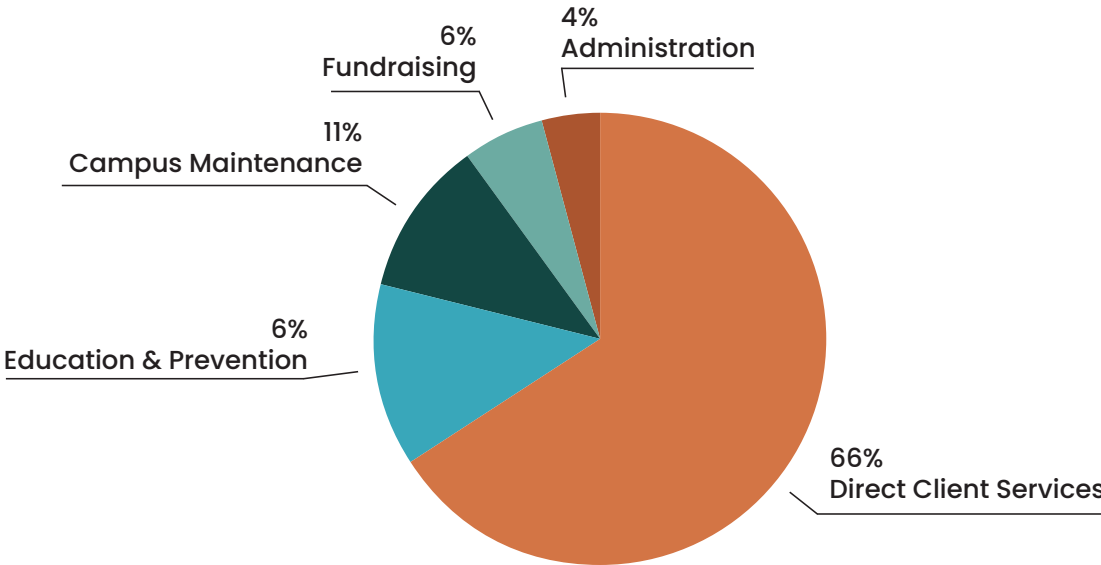
